## Alcohol Free Tigers

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Students from McKinley High School.

**PROBLEM:** Prevent underage drinking on the weekends after athletic sporting events.

**PROJECT:** Produce the prevention of underage drinking t-shirts and host family nights after athletic events to educate adults and youth.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

Poor family supervision and youth ability to purchase alcohol. We want to educate and inform families about teen's easy access to get alcohol on weekends.

#### Protective:

Peer disapproval of ATOD use and family attachment. Family nights would consist of bringing family to sporting events and to after-the-game get togethers. We are going to create shirts with slogans: "Proud to be Alcohol-Free Tigers." We, along with family members, will wear these shirts at family nights.

**OBJECTIVE:** Parents will become more aware of what their child is doing on the weekends and after athletic events. 20 people will wear our shirts to the sporting events and family nights at the first 2006-07 football game.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Ongoing.

**MEASUREMENT:** We will count the number of t-shirts made and worn to the first 2006 football game. We will also get feedback from parents at family nights to see if they know more about their teenagers.

## Boys and Girls Club of Hawaii

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Boys and Girls Club members from Waianae.

**PROBLEM:** Underage drinking is becoming an issue on our beaches and parks.

**PROJECT:** To coordinate an alcohol-free dance.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Ability to purchase alcohol - community.
- 2) Poor family supervision - family.
- 3) ATOD use by friends - peers.

#### Protective:

- 1) Community opportunity for post involvement.
- 2) Family opportunities.
- 3) Churches.

**OBJECTIVE:** 100 youth in middle school will participate in an alcohol-free dance in June 2006.

**COMPLETION DATE:** June 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** Number of participants collected from sign-in sheets.

## Bulldogs: Kaimuki High School PEP

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Students from Kaimuki High School.

### PROBLEM:

- 1) Teens that drive while under the influence of alcohol.
- 2) Teens that speed on streets in our community.
- 3) Teens that race on highways in/around our community.
- 4) Teens that drive without a legal license, insurance, permission.

**PROJECT:** Remember Me projects with driver's education and Protecting You and Protecting Me.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Teens can cause serious or fatal traffic crashes in our community.
- 2) Teen drivers that cause serious or fatal traffic crashes outside of our community.
- 3) Teen drivers that kill others, themselves and cause life threatening situations on our roads and highways.

#### Protective:

Alternatives and positive activities like early driver's education, awareness and prevention programs that are facilitated by peers.

**OBJECTIVE:** Attitudes and choices will change due to positive factual influences.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Four months with a proposal to continue indefinitely.

**MEASUREMENT:** Through evaluation given to all participants and their advisors. Observable changes due to student reflections before and after each lesson (pre and post test).

## HPD Explorer Team 1

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Students from HPD Explorers (Coordinated by Officer Derek Yee)

**PROBLEM:** Our community problem is marijuana use in school/among youth and lack of knowledge on the effects of marijuana.

**PROJECT:** Educate youth on the effects of drugs through the creation of posters, etc.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Considered "okay" to use marijuana.
- 2) Broken homes.
- 3) Parent influence.
- 4) Peer pressure.

#### Protective:

- 1) Drug testing for sports.
- 2) Short supply.
- 3) Extra activities.
- 4) Make posters/signs.
- 5) Drug awareness.

**OBJECTIVE:** Target elementary classes in Waianae and Kapolei (4th grade class).

**COMPLETION DATE:** June 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** Elementary students to have a basic knowledge of drugs and its effects. Number of participants in poster contest.

## James Campbell High

**TEAM MEMBERS:** No team roster submitted.

**PROBLEM:** Fighting leads to violence.

**PROJECT:** Peacemaking mandatory school-wide assembly.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Family domain - poor family supervision, parental attitudes favorable towards anti-social behavior.
- 2) School domain - low school commitment.

#### Protective:

Peer-Individual domain - rewards for antisocial involvement and rebelliousness.

**OBJECTIVE:** Peer educators from Mrs. Akana's class (with leaders Keri, Cora, Pam, Hailey, Krislynn) will address the problem.

**COMPLETION DATE:** April 20, 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** Through the A-L-O-H-A Challenge led by Mr. Allan Silva, we should see less fights, more self-respect, more cooperation. Survey will be conducted before and after the assembly.

## Kamehameha Scholars

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kamehameha Schools and Kamehameha Scholars.

**PROBLEM:** We will focus on decreasing drug use by middle school students. We want to heighten middle school student's awareness of the negative effects of drug use.

**PROJECT:** We will hold a three-on-three basketball tournament for middle school students to promote healthy lifestyles and heighten awareness of the risks of drug use.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

Low perceived risk of ATOD use: We want to change our peer's attitudes that drug use is okay.

#### Protective:

Peer disapproval of ATOD use: We want to see a community where people understand the risks of drug use and also disapprove of its use.

**OBJECTIVE:** 50 students will receive an information packet on the dangers of drug use at our event.

**COMPLETION DATE:** July 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** 10 teams of 5 students each will enter our tournament and receive our informational packet on the dangers of drug use.

## Kamehameha Scholars – Hui `Ekahi

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kamehameha Scholars - Waianae, Pearl City, and Kapolei.

**PROBLEM:** We will focus on youth gangs because they are negative examples to our youth.

**PROJECT:** We will plan and produce a Youth Festival with youth musical groups, resource fair. Public service announcement, etc. to show the community the positive activities youth are involved in and contributing to.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

Gang initiation: peer disapproval/peer pressure, Anti-Social behavior: negative effect on education, and control neighborhood/community.

#### Protective:

Join a "positive" club, positive participation, family involvement/participation/Christian/cultural activities, positive peer pressure, and positive school activities.

**OBJECTIVE:** Kamehameha Scholars Hui `Ekahi will plan and implement a Youth Festival by June 2007.

**COMPLETION DATE:** June 2007.

**MEASUREMENT:** Participants will complete a survey to measure the effectiveness of the event and will be registered to win a prize as an incentive to completing the survey.

## **Kau Kau**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kamehameha Schools, Pearl City High School, MBTA, Pearl City Highland Intermediate School.

**PROBLEM:** Graffiti at Pearl City High School.

**PROJECT:** Project Art in effect. Community awareness and graffiti bust.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

**Risk:**

Parental supervision, low school commitment, and engaging in problem behaviors.

**Protective:**

Opportunities for positive involvement and school opportunities.

**OBJECTIVE:** The students and parents/faculty and community will be educated on this issue. Attitude changes regarding graffiti.

**COMPLETION DATE:** One year.

**MEASUREMENT:** No graffiti at Pearl City High School. See one wall of art. Number of students participating.

## **Kea`au Middle: Ola`a Community Center**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Students from Kea`au Middle School.

**PROBLEM:** We are going to address the problem of drugs in our community which cause people to hurt others and do bad things. Too many people are using and selling drugs which makes them abuse others.

**PROJECT:** Make posters, show anti-drug video and present video at Earth Day, t-shirts (anti-drug message kids - personalized).

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

**Risk:**

We want to change the attitudes by showing people how bad drugs really are by getting them to join our activity.

**Protective:**

Raise public awareness with our activities. Get children involved with our community.

**OBJECTIVE:** 25 children from Ola`a will participate in our activities.

**COMPLETION DATE:** March 2007.

**MEASUREMENT:**

- 1) Number of people that participated at Earth Day.
- 2) Number of shirts distributed.
- 3) Number of people who see the video.

## **Kea`au Middle School**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Bay Clinic, Kea`au Middle School and Kamehameha High School students.

**PROBLEM:** Our community problem is that students are selling and buying drugs within our school. The students don't quite see or understand the consequences of buying or selling drugs. Kids who are selling the drugs are influencing the younger kids. They don't see the consequences to themselves, drug (marijuana) is a gateway to other drugs (cocaine, ice, etc.). Drugs are an outlet.

**PROJECT:** Powerpoint presentation at an assembly. Sign waving. Social studies assignment.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

**Risk:**

- 1) Family - not enough attention from parents. Family involved in drugs, encourage it/approve, don't consider normal.

**Protective:**

- 1) Have future goals.
- 2) Positive people in life (family, friends, counselors).
- 3) School activities.

**OBJECTIVE:** Peer attitudes will change towards substance abuse due to the increase in information/knowledge on dangers/consequences. End of school year 100%.

**COMPLETION DATE:** April 21, 2006 (National Youth Service Day).

**MEASUREMENT:** Response/essays. Summary on what they learned.

## **Kuhio Community Coalition Youth**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Youth from Parents and Children Together - Iolani and Farrington High Schools and Kaewai Elementary School.

**PROBLEM:** Decreasing graffiti in our community. We find graffiti has a very negative impact on our community's reputation, promotes violence amongst community gangs (youth and adults), and destroys community resources.

**PROJECT:** Committee meetings will be held twice a month after neighborhood/youth patrol reports the graffiti in the community. Then the committee will form a paint-off day.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

**Risk:**

- 1) Community disorganization - because management is unable to act quickly on the graffiti challenge, we need to organize a committee to take off the graffiti.
- 2) Rebelliousness - we feel individuals do graffiti to build up their reputation or make a name for and express themselves.

**Protective:**

- 1) Community opportunities for positive involvement: slid rock, Teen Program, Open gym, etc...
- 2) Belief in moral order - the community has different perspectives on graffiti.

**OBJECTIVE:** The committee will consist of six youth and four adults. By forming the committee, we will decrease the percentage of graffiti to at least 50% by August 15, 2006.

**COMPLETION DATE:** August 15, 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** Maintenance reports, neighborhood/youth patrol reports, security reports, and HPD and Weed/Seed (GIS and Graffiti reports).

## Olomana

**TEAM MEMBERS:** No team roster submitted.

**PROBLEM:** The challenge we'll focus on is to achieve a drug-free environment on campus. We are specifically concerned that the youth (students) don't recognize or realize the effects of the consequence of drug use and abuse. Our goal is for students to engage in school academics and succeed while in a sober state of mind.

**PROJECT:** Awareness assembly, including games and activities teaching students about the risk factors of drug use. Guest speakers.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:****Risk:**

Effects of drugs - cocaine, meth, marijuana, ecstasy, etc.

**Protective:**

School based activities may decrease the amount of students under the influence.

**OBJECTIVE:** Health classes will increase the awareness of the risk factors of drugs; they will write about risk factor and submit them to the school newspaper.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Not provided.

**MEASUREMENT:** Survey.

## The Regulators

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Students from Law Enforcement Explorer Program (Coordinated by Officer Scott Tamasaka)

**PROBLEM:** The challenge we'll focus on is to educate

the public on underage drinking.

**PROJECT:** Our project will help us solve underage drinking by having a "Positive Choices Night" fun event.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:****Risk:**

- 1) Friends' ATOD use - we want to educate friends to not pressure others to drink alcohol.
- 2) Sensation seeking - we want to show them fun without alcohol.
- 3) Favorable attitudes toward ASB (?) - we want to show acceptance to them without them feeling guilty.

**Protective:**

- 1) Peer disapproval of ATOD use - we want to show them that it's okay to be different and that everyone has choices.
- 2) Belief in the moral order - we want to educate parents on how to help guide their teen to a healthy lifestyle such as different activities.

**OBJECTIVE:** We hope that teens' attitude towards underage drinking will change. After this event, hopefully, underage drinking will decrease. We hope their attitude will change immediately after the event.

**COMPLETION DATE:** February 2007.

**MEASUREMENT:** We will measure the effectiveness of our project by the amount of participants attended. Before/after surveys and suggestion/comment box.



# Team Action Plans Adult Teams

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## Ewalution

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kahi Mohala, HPD/Weed and Seed, Hale Kipa, Coalition for a Drug-Free Hawaii, Boys and Girls Club of Hawaii-Hale Pono, Ewa Beach Elementary, and Ilima Intermediate School.

**PROBLEM:** Alcohol usage, lack of pro-social activities, and fights.

**PROJECT:** Ewalution's Family Fun Day. Clinics.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Exposure to community alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.
- 2) Interaction with anti-social peers.

#### Protective:

- 1) Family attachment.
- 2) Family opportunities.
- 3) Family rewards.

**OBJECTIVE:** 50 families will participate in the Family Fun Day by Summer 2007.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Summer 2007; quarterly.

**MEASUREMENT:** Sign-in sheets and attendance.

## Hale Ohana O Kapa`a

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Hale Ohana O Kapa`a, Kapaa Business Association, and Kauai Police Department.

**PROBLEM:** Our community challenge is to minimize underage drinking and drug use with our youth.

**PROJECT:** Participating in our Kauai Coconut Festival held in Kapaa Town. Activities include drug-free activities for kids of all ages.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Family supervision and negligence.
- 2) Peer pressure.
- 3) Exposure to family ATOD use.
- 4) Availability - youth are able to get alcohol and drugs without parents approval and knowledge.

#### Protective:

- 1) Community opportunities for positive involvement.
- 2) Family rewards for positive involvement; praise them.

**OBJECTIVE:** Our community wants to change our youth perceptions of drinking and underage drug use by educating them with positive information and activities.

**COMPLETION DATE:** October 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** One way - for example, coloring contest. We ask for name, age, school attend - one way to track attendance. Short survey to see if we have repeated attendance, or new attendance. For our survey, we can reward them for participating in survey with donations from Fun Factory, McDonald's and items from other community businesses. Another one is a "live" band.

## Kailua/Waimanalo Surf Riders

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kailua High School, Honolulu Police Department, UH Asian/Pacific Islander Violence Prevention Center, and HPD District 4.

**PROBLEM:** Family's influencing negative youths, identity (violence, drug and alcohol use). Fix negative community identity.

**PROJECT:** Positive Identity Assemblies.

### RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:

#### Risk:

- 1) Lack of providing positive events or activities to help.
- 2) Lack of positive role models (UH, Kailua alumni, Hawaiian).
- 3) Frequent exposure to drugs, violence, and alcohol.
- 4) Parental attitude approves of behavior.

#### Protective:

- 1) Positive afterschool activities.
- 2) Positive role models.
- 3) Mini PSAs.
- 4) Youth play a large role in this action plan.

**OBJECTIVE:** Help students to create a positive identity and parents (adult role model). Change negative identity of school community.

**COMPLETION DATE:** No date provided.

**MEASUREMENT:** Surveillance survey conducted by Asian/Pacific Violence Prevention Center.

## **Ka`u Community Action Team**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Queen Liliuokalani Children's Center, Na'alehu School/Right Track, Lokahi Treatment, Adult Mental Health Division, Ocean View Residents, Naalehu School (PCNC), Ka`u Family Center, Kau High School, Malama A Ho`opilipono

**PROBLEM:** The challenge we will focus on is decreasing the intergenerational cycle of substance abuse among Ka`u families. Specifically we are concerned with the lack of family cohesiveness and parent/child interaction.

**PROJECT:** Ka`u Community Family Fun Nite, Pool Bash, and Women's Nite Out.

### **RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

#### **Risk:**

Favorable parental attitudes and involvement in problem behavior.

#### **Protective:**

We want to increase positive family participation and child/parent interaction.

**OBJECTIVE:** We want to increase positive family participation and child/parent interaction in community activities -- 20 families by 12/31/06.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Not provided. (12/31/06?)

**MEASUREMENT:** Compare to 2005 activities, survey, sign-in sheet and evaluation.

## **Key Project**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Members from the Key Project (Windward community).

**PROBLEM:** The challenge we face is a high number of dysfunctional families due to drug use in community.

**PROJECT:** Narcanon presentation required prior to attendance of activity.

### **RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

#### **Risk:**

Exposure to family ATOD use: educate teens about effects of drugs by providing alternative activities and education.

#### **Protective:**

Community rewards for positive involvement: Community based activities with supervision and rewards for positive participation.

**OBJECTIVE:** 20 people will participate in our drop-in sleep over on May 19 - 20, 2006.

**COMPLETION DATE:** May 20, 2006.

**MEASUREMENT:** Number of people participating; post-test.

## **Kuhio Community Coalition**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kuhio Homes, Parents and Children Together, Linapuni School, Samoan Service Provider Association, Honolulu Police Department, and Kuhio Park Terrace.

**PROBLEM:** The problem in our community is rampant drug activity. Much of the dealing is done by non-residents - visitors or unauthorized tenants. Drug activity affects our families by creating secondary problems, such as: child abuse and neglect, substance abuse/dependence, financial/housing crises and truancy.

**PROJECT:** Citizen Patrol - promote as a "get fit" club. Create shifts to accommodate schedules, recruit groups to get involved, address documentation process, offer training by HPD, coordination with management/agencies, recruitment at events.

### **RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:**

#### **Risk:**

Community disorganization, exposure to community ATOD use - we believe that drug activity is a community wide problem, and residents have found very little success in addressing these problems. Crime, violence, and delinquency are prevalent within the community, with security and maintenance problems persisting.

#### **Protective:**

Community opportunities for positive involvement - citizen patrol, community events. Community rewards for positive involvement - incentives (door prizes), refreshments, volunteer hours for students, housing/first to work requirements.

**OBJECTIVE:** Do more outreach to increase participation in Teen Center program by five youth per quarter (20 by the end of the year). Improve in the process of reporting and correcting community health and safety issues. Increase participation in citizen patrol groups (minimum of three each) and frequency - once a week by end of year.

**COMPLETION DATE:** March 1, 2007.

**MEASUREMENT:** Review Teen Center and Citizen/Youth Patrol attendance sheets. Frequency of patrol walks. Quality of documentation. Follow-up on staff referrals.

## **County of Maui/ Maui Police Department**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Representatives from Maui Police Department.

**PROBLEM:** The drug ICE and our Community.

**PROJECT:** Education and assistance to help our community combat this problem To mobilize our community and help them help themselves.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:****Risk:**

The Project will address the very high use of ICE within our local community. The use of ICE and the addiction within our young populations. The highly addictive nature of the drug and the difficulty in beating the addiction.

**Protective:**

Attempt to educate our community on the dangers and the addictiveness of ICE. To provide one location, for the community, to find assistance. To inform our community how to obtain assistance in obtaining help for themselves, friends and/or family. Educate our community on this growing problem.

**OBJECTIVE:** The action plan will attempt to change the community and make it more aware of the situation of ICE within our community. How much it will affect our community depends on how many are ready to change. The plan is to take place during the summer of 2006.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Not provided. (Summer of 2006?)

**MEASUREMENT:** The effectiveness may not be able to be measured at this time. As with most projects/programs that deal with prevention/education it is difficult to determine the effectiveness. The true measure is the long-term health of our community.

## Na`Ohana O Kamehameha A Me Ka`ahumanu

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Kamehameha Homes Tenant Association, Kaahumanu Security Walk, Honolulu Community Action Program.

**PROBLEM:** Underage drinking, drug activity, juvenile delinquent activities.

**PROJECT:** Na`Ohana o Kamehameha a me Ka`ahumanu Community Fair.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:****Risk:**

- 1) Availability of alcohol and drugs.
- 2) Community laws and norms favorable to drug use, underage drinking and other crimes.
- 3) Transitions and mobility - lack of community continuity.
- 4) Low neighborhood attachment/community disorganization.
- 5) Extreme economic deprivation.
- 6) Family history of problem behavior.
- 7) Family management problems.
- 8) Family conflict.
- 9) Favorable parental attitudes/involvement in problem behaviors.
- 10) Academic failure beginning in late elementary school.
- 11) Lack of commitment to school.
- 12) Early and persistent antisocial behavior.

13) Rebelliousness.

14) Friends that engage in problem behavior.

15) Favorable attitudes toward the problem behavior.

16) Early initiation of problem behavior.

17) Constitutional factors.

**Protective:**

1) Study hall.

2) Computer classes.

3) Island Youth (Polynesian dancers).

4) Summer fun.

5) Neighborhood Watch.

6) Martial Arts class.

**OBJECTIVE:**

1) Youth ages 10-18 years old (middle to high school) will increase in participation in community activities.

2) Improve attendance in school.

3) Decrease incidents of trespassing/delinquent activity.

4) Increase family oriented activities.

5) Change in favorable attitudes toward behavior.

**COMPLETION DATE:** July 15, 2006 10 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.

**MEASUREMENT:** From 40% to 75% participation.

## Puna Community Action Team

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Hawaii County Police Department, Hawaii County Economic Opportunity Council Dropout Prevention Program, Representatives from Puna Community Action Team

**PROBLEM:** There is drug activity where children congregate to go to or return from school.

**PROJECT:**

1) Change physical environment in collaboration with schools, state government, county government, businesses and community by building covered student bus stops in Pahoia, Hawaiian Beaches by June 2006.

2) Pahoia and Hawaiian Beaches Community Association take ownership by developing a schedule of parent volunteers by July 2006.

3) Develop a sustainable model for other communities to replicate by August 2006.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:****Risk:**

Poor family supervision and exposure to community ATOD use.

**Protective:**

Community opportunities for involvement, family opportunities for positive involvement, school opportunities for positive involvement, and belief in moral order.

**OBJECTIVE:**

1) Reduce number of single person bus stops by 30%.

2) Decrease reported incidents of violence/drug use at bus stops by 75%.

**COMPLETION DATE:** Not provided (June 2006?)

**MEASUREMENT:**

- 1) Parent survey (pre/post).
- 2) Police incident reports.
- 3) Evidence of the successfully built structure.
- 4) Evidence of a community monitoring schedule.
- 5) Evidence of a model for replication in other communities.
- 6) Future bus stops.

**Waipahu Community Coalition**

**TEAM MEMBERS:** Honolulu Police Department, Waipahu Community Association, Grace Bible Church, Department of Health.

**PROBLEM:** Our focus is on underage drinking (including adults) and drugs in the Pupule Park. The challenge we face is that youth do not have organized activities.

**PROJECT:** Create a calendar of youth activities in Pupule Park involving community agencies and churches with implementation.

**RISK/PROTECTIVE FACTORS ADDRESSED:****Risk:**

Cultural issues, social attitude, parental attitudes, and acceptance among peers.

**Protective:**

Education through ethnic influential leaders, preventative and deterrence through on-going sports activities, increase self-esteem by organizing activities such as music, crafts, etc.
