§13-100-1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless otherwise provided:

"O'opu" means the members of the family Gobiidae known as the o'opu nakea (Awaous stamineus), o'opu naniha (A. genevittatus), o'opu nopili (Sicyopterus stimpsoni), and o'opu alamo'o (Lentipes concolor).

"Hinana" means young o'opu. [Eff: AUG 14 1989 ]

§13-100-2 Prohibited activities. No person shall:

- (1) Fish for, catch, take, injure, or kill any o'opu or hinana with any gill, draw, drag, cross or seine net;
- (2) Possess any gill, draw, drag, cross or seine net on or about the river/stream bank or in the water where o'opu or hinana can be taken; and
- (3) Sell, or offer for sale, any o'opu or hinana, provided that any o'opu or hinana raised in private ponds or waters may be harvested and sold. [Eff: AUG 14 1989 ] (Auth: §187A-5)
