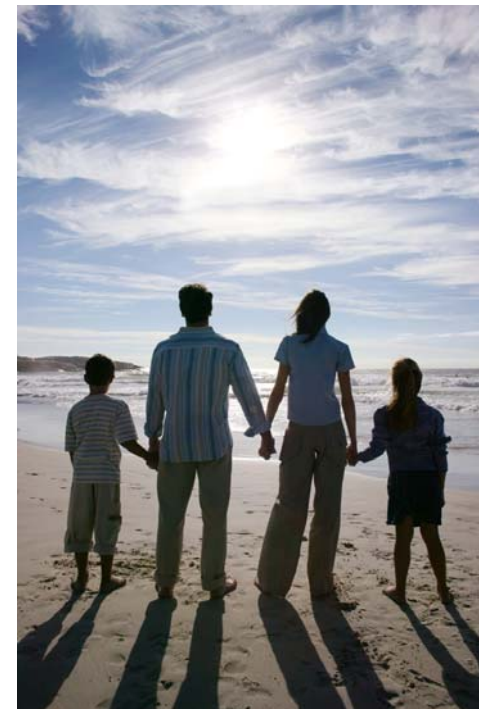

WHAT IS ATR?

- Access To Recovery (ATR) is a Presidential initiative through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (SAMHSA CSAT)
- In Hawaii, on the Island of Oahu, just over \$8 million has been awarded for three years to assist over 2,700 individuals struggling to recover from methamphetamine addiction
- Funding helps expand capacity of Recovery Support Services, particularly in the areas of Culture and Faith Based Organizations (CFBOs).
- Voucher based funding is a fee for service that is electronically deposited in the service provider's bank account, so the client never has to worry about handling cash or paper coupons
- Clients select services and providers from a list of authorized organizations that matches their needs and belief systems
- Provides funding for: Child Care, Transportation, Housing Support Services, Cultural and Spiritual Support, Education and Training, and Sober Support Activities

Providers work with our RSS Unit Agencies to provide ATR services to individuals who are working hard on their recovery, and need support to stay on their path.
