

ACT 68 Worker Shortages in the Construction Industry

Worker Shortage: A worker shortage situation will be declared for a fiscal year, when the percent of the annual average of regular unemployment insurance claims (CIU) for the Construction industry to the number of jobs reported from the Occupational Employment Survey (OES) is below 6.5% for the preceding calendar year.

Exemption Request: Should a contractor find that there is a shortage of Hawaii residents qualified to work in a trade that he needs, he may file a petition to the Director of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to request an exemption from hiring within the state. The Department will make a decision within a one-month period and the decision will be final. The petition must include the following information:
