<b>Hawaii SOS Conference – September 25 and 26, 2008</b>	<p><u>September 25, 2008:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This part of the conference will focus on vog.</li> <li>The conference will be held from 1:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the Hawaii Convention Center. Attendance is free.</li> <li>The seminar will be broadcasted on Olelo and available via webcast so that Big Islanders can get access.</li> <li>There will be displays for personal protective equipment (PPE), monitors and filters.</li> <li>DLIR's website (<a href="http://hawaii.gov/labor">http://hawaii.gov/labor</a>) contains information about the seminar and vog.</li> </ul> <p><u>September 26, 2008:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This part of the conference will focus on compliance emphasis programs and construction accidents.</li> <li>The conference will be held from 8:00 a.m. – 3:45 p.m. at the Hawaii Convention Center. The cost is \$50 which includes lunch. Registration can be done online.</li> <li>Copies of the letter that was mailed to employers were distributed. Each letter contained fact sheets that pertained to the appropriate industry. The fact sheets provided a brief overview of the hazard, what to do and where to get help.</li> <li>Help tables will be available to answer questions and give information on where to get additional help.</li> <li>Names of companies attending will be kept confidential from HIOSH and OSHA.</li> </ul> <p>Copy of the conference brochure being printed was passed around. Members will be emailed an electronic copy for their use.</p> <p>If attendance is exceeded, HIOSH will take as many as they can without violating the fire code.</p>	
<b>Comments on Proposed OSHA Amendment Regarding PPE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Packets of proposed OSHA amendment regarding PPE dated August 19, 2008, were distributed for comment.</li> <li>The amendment is to add clarifying language that non-compliance with PPE and training requirements may expose employers to liability on a per employee basis.</li> <li>Comments was made that not enough clarification is given. The HIOSH Advisory Committee would like HIOSH is make sure that the standard is done clearly so that everyone will be able to interpret.</li> <li>Since OSHA would like HIOSH's feedback by September 18, 2008, HIOSH requested the HIOSH Advisory Committee send comments no later than September 11, 2008. Mr. Dumlao will forward comments to federal OSHA.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If no comments are received, the proposed amendment automatically becomes the rule. A hearing can be requested to provide an opportunity for comments.</li> </ul>	
<b>Status of Tower Crane Certification</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There is a proposed amendment to the crane certification to include certification for tower crane operators.</li> <li>Currently, only mobile cranes and certain other cranes are covered for certification purposes. Riggers are not included.</li> <li>All agencies including the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, have signed off and endorsed that the amendment should go to public hearing.</li> <li>Currently, the amendment is awaiting Governor's approval.</li> <li>After the Governor approves, the amendment will go to public hearing. HIOSH will be soliciting comments. [Update: On or about September 8, 2008, HIOSH received preliminary approval to hold a public hearing.]</li> <li>Operators are shipped to the mainland to get tower crane certification. The long-term impact is costly. The General Contractors Association was notified to look into bringing someone locally to do tower crane certification.</li> <li>Recommendation was made to have a HIOSH Advisory Committee representative from the Operating Engineers, Local 3.</li> <li>The Operating Engineers is an integral part of the Hoisting Machine Operators Advisory Board (HMOAB). The HMOAB approved the amendment. Mr. Jamesner Dumlao will make a request to the Chair Tom Vendetta to make a presentation for the HIOSH Advisory Committee on what their plans are for training, including the practical exam, which is the hardest to achieve. In the meantime, members will be able to get immediate feedback at the Hawaii SOS conference.</li> <li>The Operating Engineers, Local 3, is aware of the new tower crane certification. Mr. Tristan Aldeguer will contact the training coordinator to see if there is a possibility of bringing someone locally. They will need a place certified to do the practical exam.</li> </ul>	
<b>Information From HIOSH Advisory Committee to HIOSH</b>		
<b>Around-the-Table Comments</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Comment was made that the HIOSH Advisory Committee did have a representative from the Operating Engineers, Local 3, years ago. Response was made that attempts were made to contact the Operating Engineers, Local 3, but have not received feedback.</li> <li>Question was asked what the possibilities are of riggers needing certification. Response was made that any prevention should be taken so that accidents do not happen. If accidents occur, government will be reactive.</li> </ul>



Response was made that OSHA will enforce the rules in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Standard for tower cranes that says shall follow the manufacturer's instruction.</li> <li>• Comment was made that government should look into the rigging regulations and not wait until accidents happen. At this time, even though nothing may happen, the HIOSH Advisory Committee should have on record that they are being proactive.</li> <li>• Mr. Les Onaka apologized for not sending in an application. An application will be provided.</li> <li>• Mr. Aldeguer notified his application was turned in.</li> <li>• Mr. Vasilash stated that the references he made regarding challenges that he experienced with the perception of exposure interpretations of standards has been with other governmental designated authorities and not with the members at the meeting.</li> </ul>
