On June 21, 2011 a check in payment of \$124,950.00 was made to settle the obligation for the equipment purchased from Intellicheck Mobilisa, Inc. DHS/FEMA reimbursed the Harbors Division in early July 2011. On November 23, 2011 the Harbors Division issued a check in payment of \$469,025.99 to settle the obligation for the equipment purchased from Electric Boat Corporation-HSI Electric Boat as the supplier and manufacturer completed the work to repair and rectify the damages so that the equipment units were restored to "as good as new condition". The manufacturer notified the Harbors Division in writing that it will warrant and guarantee
