5. Nature of the Emergency

After the discovery of the severely deteriorated deck on the H-1 Freeway townbound lanes in the Salt Lake area, the Pearl City Viaduct was inspected by our Structural consultant. State engineers determined that an immediate bridge deck replacement was warranted as the condition of the deck would pose a possible danger to motorists as well as people below the structure.

8. Description of goods, services, or construction to be purchased

Three of the five lanes were affected with the area of spot repairs totaling about 175,000 square feet. The deck replacement work included demolition and chipping of the existing concrete deck, forming for the repairs, installing new reinforcing steel, pouring concrete (approximately 10,000 C.Y. of concrete). There were approx. 24 people working both above and below the deck of the freeway for approx. 6 weeks.



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12. Chief Procurement Officer's comments:

The department states that work on the H-1 freeway, Pearl City viaduct has been on-going for the past 10 years. However, the specific situation required immediate attention as determined by the department after a consultant's findings. Pursuant to HAR §3-122-88 and HRS §103D-307 emergency procurements may be utilized to purchase only the immediate needs for the emergency and not subsequent non-emergency requirements. Approval is granted based on the department's determination to respond to the immediate attention needed to repair what was potentially a danger to the public and for the amount of \$4,920,000.
